Results from a survey among African ZEF alumni

The doctoral program can finally reap the fruits of 11 years of hard labor since its inception 1999. It has been a stepping stone to promising careers of many ZEF alumni. A survey among participants from Africa carried out in 2009 by Benjamin Schraven, Senior Researcher at ZEFa, shows that the main target of the program is certainly being achieved, which is training future decision-makers from developing as well as from industrialized countries for international careers in a development-related context. One of the outcomes of the survey is that 85% of the graduates from Africa returned to their home countries to take up promising positions there.

The survey results also show that many African alumni contribute with their knowledge, expertise and experience to political and societal processes in their home countries, even though this takes place on an institutional rather than on an individual level. This development-relevant involvement in consultancy and decision-making processes can be ascribed to ZEF's selection procedure of doctoral candidates from Africa: Most of the candidates come from institutions with good networks enabling them to communicate their research results and have impact at a national level.

ZEF prize for an outstanding doctoral thesis (call for applications)

The "Friends of ZEF" (Gesellschaft der Freunde der Entwicklungsforschung e.V.) award a prize of 1500 Euro for an outstanding doctoral thesis in development research every two years. In October 2011, the prize will be awarded for the fifth time. All doctoral students of ZEF and those who have conducted their doctoral research in affiliation with ZEF or participated in the courses of the International Doctoral Studies Program at ZEF between May 2009 and May 2011, with a degree "very good" (magna cum laude) or "excellent" (summa cum laude) are eligible and are encouraged to apply.
