Biodiversity and ecology of Afromontane rainforests with wild *Coffea arabica* L. populations in Ethiopia

The Afromontane rainforests of Ethiopia are the natural habitats of wild populations of *Coffea arabica*. These forests are highly fragmented and threatened due to human impacts. This study provides a comparative plant diversity analysis of five geographically separated Afromontane rainforests in which wild Arabica coffee occurs. The rainforests are different floristically but forest areas with coffee occurrence are similar in structure and species composition. In addition, the distribution and ecology of wild coffee populations, the effect of wild coffee management on plant species diversity as well as conservation options are discussed.
