As I conclude, I would like to highlight our expectations for the coming years:

The world is facing several challenges and these calls for more collaborative actions where research can play a major role.
- Our German partners, we kindly ask you to encourage your companies in Niger to establish
 early career programs to harness the skills of young graduates from the German sponsored
 centres.
- To the Coordinators of excellence centres and WASCAL, it is urgent to integrate career
 development and coaching modules for graduate students into your curricula to facilitate
 their integration into the job market.
- And finally, Dear Colleagues, our journey will **chalk** a lot of successes. However, we will also face a lot of failures to become experts and address the challenges of our communities
