Scope & Topics

Land use and land cover have been one of the first and main products from remote sensing data. Their dynamics are strongly influenced by socio-economic factors and political decisions, generating a need for adequate mapping and monitoring tools. New sensor systems are being launched, which open up new challenges. As a consequence, robust and sophisticated analysis methods are required to extract accurate information. Furthermore, multi-temporal and multi-sensor approaches are becoming more and more important not only for change detection, but also for more detailed classification approaches.


