#### NEWS about STAFF AND GUESTS

Manfred Denich and Margaret Jend (ZEFc) visited Addis Ababa (Ethiopia) from February 2 to 9 2008. Margaret Jend gave a training course on digital photography and image processing for the purpose of documenting biodiversity in coffee forests in the context of the CoCE project. Besides, Manfred Denich, met (1) local partners in the coffee project and (2) representatives of ILRI/IWMI to discuss the progress of the PhD students in the joint research project on "Improving Water Productivity of Crop-Livestock Systems of sub-Saharan Africa". Hans-Dieter Evers (ZEFa) visited Vietnam from January 15 to February 02 2008 to meet with BIGS-DR students and to survey possible field research sites for PhD students of the WISDOM (Water-related Information System for the sustainable Development of the Mekong Delta) project.

Jens Liebe (ZEFc) recently joined ZEF, assuming the position of GLOWA Volta coordinator. He is a Hydrologist by training and has conducted his MSc research in the framework of the GLOWA Volta Project (1999 to 2003). He received the Hans-Hartwig Ruthenberg Award for his Master thesis on "Estimation of Water Storage Capacity and Evaporation Losses of Small Reservoirs in the Upper East Region of Ghana". In 2004 he joined the Department of Biological and Environmental Engineering at Cornell University, USA, and conducted his graduate research within the "Small Reservoirs Project" in northern Ghana. His scientific focus is on the hydrology of semi-arid areas, small reservoirs, and on the use of remote sensing in data scarce areas.

Paul Vlek and Bao Le (ZEFc) were invited to participate in an FAO workshop on "Land Degradation Assessment in Drylands (LADA)" in Rome, Italy, from January 28 to 29 2008.

Paul Vlek (ZEFc) has taken up the second part of his sabbatical leave at the Office of International Research, Education and Development (OIRED), Virginia Polytechnical Institute and State University (Virginia Tech), USA, as of January 10 2008.

Tobias Wünscher (ZEFb) participated in a workshop "International Payments for Ecosystem Services: Alternative Mechanisms for Financing Environmental Management", held in Geneva 28-29 January 2008, which was co-organized by the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) and World Conservation Union (IUCN) in close collaboration with the Secretariat of the Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD). He gave a presentation on "Targeting Payments for Ecosystem Services", which was co-authored by former ZEF-researcher Stefanie Engel. The objective of the workshop was to review contributions to a book addressed to policy makers with the aim of facilitating the implementation of an international scheme for payments for ecosystem services.
